

# Stepping Up: Succession Planning Projects



#### Taking the Leap...

Getting adult volunteers to step up to manager and supporter roles can be a challenge, but they are needed for us to function as a movement. We believe that one way to support volunteers to transition into these roles is through short term projects. This guide suggests a variety of different projects that have two aims: to support local scouting, and to help volunteers take the leap into manager and supporter roles.



### Website Design

Local websites are one of the primary ways new members contact local groups and districts. This project could look at launching a new website for your district (or group), or if one already exists looking at updating it. One district receives around 100 new joining enquiries a year through their website, so this is one to look at to promote growth. Websites can be launched for less than £7 a year, so definitely a worthwhile investment.

#### Media Development

We don't shout anywhere near enough about Scouting, so another great perception project is looking at Media. Whether this is looking at getting news out into social media or trying to get local press coverage this is another great way to promote growth of both young people and volunteers.
